When importing, the references are automatically deduplicated. Therefore not suitable for systematic reviews. • Direct import with Web Importer doesn't work sufficiently in CataloguePlus and many databases, it is necessary to save the references as RIS file. • References from RIS files may be missing • Alumni who don't have an account yet, can't use the Institutional Edition. • After graduation or termination of your employment, you have rights to use the Institutional Edition for one more year.
Zotero	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • References can be shared and edited within the group. • Collaboration on documents with Zotero references. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Possible to import PDF files. • Fast processing of large number of references. • Possible to import directly from PubMed. • Easy import of web pages. • Compatible with Google Docs and Libre Office. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not possible to create or adjust citation styles. • Limited storage (max 300 MB), expansion possible for \$ 20-120 per year. • Direct import from Google Scholar only possible from the first 1 or 2 screens. • Direct import from Ebsco, Proquest and Science Direct databases does not work sufficiently for several titles at once.
