Please take note of the following important instructions:

- You must have passed all listed courses in order to meet the requirements.
- If you have not yet received all your grades, you may also include courses you have not yet completed. In that case, indicate **NFY** (Not Finished Yet).
- It is only permitted to list the same course under multiple qualification areas, if the total number of ECs for that course is divided across the relevant areas.
Note: You decide how to divide the ECs, as long as the total ECs per course are not exceeded. You must always indicate the total EC value of the course in parentheses
- For all requirements, an average mark of 7.5 or higher is required (or equivalent, such as A-/B+/3.5 in the US system, a B in the ECTS system, or a 2.1 Hons in the British system)
