

## Brief manual for students: submitting an assignment for a plagiarism check in Urkund

The work that you submit in Canvas using the Canvas plagiarism framework is checked in Urkund for plagiarism, in other words for similarities to other texts. A report is produced once the check is complete. This shows the lecturer which parts of the text bear similarities and where the sources can be found. Depending on the settings that the lecturer sets for the assignment, you may or may not view the results. This manual describes how to submit an assignment using the Canvas plagiarism framework.

### Using the plagiarism framework

- Open your assignment in Canvas.
- If your lecturer uses the Canvas plagiarism framework, you will eventually reach the screen prompting you to submit an assignment shown below.
