How to apply for a Canadian loan

1. Apply for a Canada Student Grant and Loan online through the local authorities of the province or territory of your permanent residency.
2. After the student sets up an account on the website and starts the application, the student will receive a Program Information Form to fill out and is required to send the filled out form to the Financial Aid Office at UvA.
3. The Financial Aid Office at UvA will complete the rest of the Program Information Form, making sure the dates and information reflects the rest of the general application.
4. The Financial Aid Office at UvA sends the completed form back to the student.
5. The student is required to upload the form in their account and will receive information from the local authorities of their province / territory if the program / student is eligible.
6. Once approved, the student will receive a 'Notice of Assessment', stating the total monetary amount they will be eligible for with this grant.
7. The student will review the Master Student Financial Assistance Agreement (MSFAA) and if accepting of the terms and conditions, the student is required to sign this agreement.
8. The student is required to submit the loan documents in their National Student Loans Service Centre (NSLSC) account.
9. The student is required to send the Confirmation of Enrolment Form to the Financial Aid Office at UvA to be signed. Note: this document cannot be signed before the student is enrolled and no more than 15 days before the start date of the academic year/term.
10. The first disbursement will be released after the Confirmation of Enrolment form is accepted by the local authorities of the province / territory of the students' permanent residency and will be disbursed into the students' bank account.

This document is written by a Canadian student and is just a guideline for how to receive a loan. This document is only meant to guide you in the right direction, since it is the student's own responsibility to know how to apply for a loan.
