career breaks

- As stated above, from August 2013 to August 2016 I was first head of teaching at the philosophy department and then programme director of the BA philosophy. During this period the faculty of humanities went through an organisational reform combined with an unforeseen severe financial crisis. This, in turn, led to a protest movement of students and teachers of the faculty of humanities, with particularly strong involvement of staff members and students of the philosophy department. For me this meant an unexpected and substantial increase in workload, and, as an effect of this, a break from my research career.
